A message from WordPlay's Executive Director

Lined up against the bookcases stood a troupe of teenagers, hailing from west side to east. Some had been raised by families comfortably settled for generations; others had only recently arrived in the country; one had been shuttled between various relatives and homeless shelters for years. Each was waiting his or her turn at the microphone, a chance to share their story through poetry. All ears and eyes in the room were trained on their voices. The youngest and final performer, a 12-yearold newly arrived to Cincinnati, had never stood in front of a mic before, let alone an audience. When she stumbled over her first line, hand to face to hide the swelling tears, the others came to her side, stood by her and wrapped their arms around her shoulders, bolstering her with their show of support. She quietly finished her piece, and she beamed.

This seemingly small slice of WordPlay captures our true essence: a space where young people activate their strengths to forge connections through creativity, exploration and validation. 2018 and 2019, years 6 and 7 for WordPlay, witnessed so much good: new students, community partners, schools, families, volunteers, Board members and staff to whom I offer my sincerest gratitude for expanding our horizons. To all who have engaged in our work, attended a performance, donated to a campaign or simply followed our progress-thank you. Just as our young poet standing before her first-ever audience, your support lifts us up to carry forward our mission, creating tangible and lasting impact for all.


SPOTLIGHT: INTERNATIONAL **CONGRESS OF YOUTH VOICES**




REVENUE & EXPENSES
